

## Buffalo Bills Coach of the Week Bills Honor Goddard After Big Win

Clarence coach Tom Goddard was named the Buffalo Bills' Coach of the Week after his Red Devils

defeated Orchard Park 37-28 last weekend.

Mike Gelz ran for 177 yards and 3 touchdowns on 28 carries to power the ground attack. Cooper Wittig

added 82 yards on

15 carries and also caught a 50-yard pass.

Quarterback Zach Lauricella ran seven times for 54 yards and 2 TDs. Wittig also completed 5 passes for 123 yards and threw no interceptions.

This is the first time that Clarence has beaten Orchard Park since the 2000 season.

"This is one of the biggest wins that we have had in the last few years," Goddard said. "The kids have really been focused on our theme this year. We are a good team but... can we play at the next level? Can we possibly be a great team?"

The Red Devils rolled up 456 yards of offense in the win over Orchard Park.

"Orchard Park is a measuring stick program in AA football," Goddard said. "The kids proved that we could play at a higher level for one week. Now we have to prove it again against Lancaster this week. We have to prove it every week."

Goddard said he was pleased with the offensive output but that there were things that needed to be improved.

"We look at our game film on Monday," he said. "We point out the positives and the things we need to work on. From that point on, we have put this win aside and move on. It's enjoyable but it's over." This is the fourth time that Goddard has been honored with the award by the Bills.

"It's great because it's for the kids, too," he said. "It's a great honor to be chosen but it's a reflection of the kids and how they played. It's a program award because it took a lot more than one person to win that football game."

Goddard played running back, tight end and linebacker for Clarence before graduating in 1968.


He also played wide receiver for lowa Wesleyan College.

"Back then they had Major College Football and Small College football," he said. "Iowa Wesleyan is an NAIA school now."

Goddard started his coaching career at Cheektowaga, serving as head coach from 1980 until 1985.

He started coaching at Clarence as an assistant on the staff in 1986 and became the head coach in 1993.

Goddard has 107 career wins.



## **Campion is J-town's Champion**

Jamestown evened its' record at 1-1 after beating Lancaster 12-0 last weekend. After losing their opener to Frontier, the Red Raiders are now in the thick of a fierce playoff battle in the AA South Division.

"Every year, the AA South is a fight from beginning to end," Jamestown coach Tom Langworthy said. "It's the toughest league in all of New York State. We are used to this type of schedule and we

expect it every year."

It was Jamestown's first win over Lancaster since the 2005 season.

"We haven't beaten them in Lancaster in ten years," Langworthy said. "Our defense is playing well. We're running the football. We feel like we can let the kids go out and play and they have reacted well to it."

Senior tailback Joev Campion led the offense as he rushed for 82 tough yards on 21 carries. Campion ground out several first downs late in the game when the Raiders were trying to drain the clock.

"Joey did a great job of holding the football," Langworthy said. "He made a couple of crucial first downs when we were trying to work the clock."

Campion played such a big role in the game because Jamestown's starter. Dvlan Monroe. sat



"He missed two games with a broken hand," Swetland said. "He played the last two games with a cast on his hand. It was challenging but he's a tough kid who plays hard and per-







## CoverStory King and His Court Depew will have to overcome the loss of lineman John Kling

Depew sweated out a tough 12-6 win over Burgard in a defensive slugfest and improved to 2-0 on the season.

The game was physical, with plenty of hard hits delivered. Neither team seemed interested in much trickery.

Just straight ahead, smash-mouth football.

After playing to a scoreless tie after three quarters, Depew surrendered the game's first TD and trailed 6-0 with 11:00 left in the game.

The Wildcats responded by mounting a pair of scoring drives, first tying the game and then taking the lead when Aaron Ertel tossed TD passes to Sam Sallaj and Anthony Emmanuele.

Depew is now 2-0 heading into this week's game with Akron. The Wildcats will also face South Park before heading into one of WNY's most anticipated games of the year when they host defending Class B champion Cheektowaga.

"We've got to take them one at a time," Depew coach Dan McGrath said, "but we want to win them all. That's a goal of ours every year."

Depew, which last won a Section 6 title in 2007, is widely considered a legitimate contender for the Class B title.

The reason is simple: The Wildcats have one of the biggest offensive lines for a Class B school in memory.

"We do have some size this year," Depew coach Dan McGrath said. "We have some pretty big kids up front."

The biggest of the behemoths is 2-way tackle John Kling, a 6-7, 285-pound senior who has already given a verbal commitment to play for the University at Buffalo

for the next four weeks after he suffered a broken foot in the win over Burgard.

"He broke it on the play before Burgard scored their touchdown," McGrath said. "He played another play but had to come out."

Kling was immediately seen by an orthopaedic doctor who helps with the team as a volunteer.

"By 11:30 that night," McGrath said, "Dr. Szarzanowicz had already seen him and had him in a boot."

Depew also lost Josh Wiechelt (6-1, 240) from the offensive line after he was banged up on a kickoff. It is

While Kling may be the highest-profile among the linemen, he also is the "rookie" of the bunch. He transferred to Depew after playing three seasons at St. Mary's.

"John was one of ours to begin with," McGrath said. "He played modified ball for us in 7th and 8th grade. When he transferred here, he was coming home where he belonged."

McGrath was pleasantly surprised when Kling enrolled in Depew last December.

"He was definitely a nice addition to the team," McGrath said. "He came out for wrestling in November. We were busy doing lifting and he jumped right into that. He knew a lot of our kids from elementary school and he quickly re-established relationships with those kids."

Unfortunately, Depew will now be without Kling

unknown how much time Wiechelt will miss.

"We had to make some pretty big adjustments," McGrath said, "but the kids who came in played very well."

Amazingly, despite the loss of Kling and Wiechelt, Depew is still huge.

Andrew Burgio (6-1, 287) is starting at left guard while senior Mike Kasprzak (6-5, 250) moved down the line to take Kling's spot at left tackle. Jaden Cotton (6-4, 292) is starting at right tackle.

"Yeah, were still pretty big," McGrath said, "but our overall average certainly went down when those two guys got injured."

Zack Krieb, a junior, was inserted into the line at center. At 5-11, Krieb is relatively small but he still weighs 280. Chris Twaragowski, the smallest lineman on the team at 5-11, 170, is now starting at right guard.

"I never want to see anyone get injured," McGrath said, "especially offensive linemen. But it created an opportunity to shuffle some other guys around and give them a chance to show what they can do."

McGrath says that he is confidant that his new line combination, although different, will be no less effective than it has been in the first two games.

"These guys are excellent pass blockers," McGrath said. "Against Burgard, we got out of our toe-to-toe offensive run game for a while and spread it out a little. We wanted to see what our skill kids could do with space. At the end, we went to Ertel's arm. We'll have to make adjustments because our team that starts the third game won't be close to the team that started the season.

Kling, who maintains an academic average of 91, is an outstanding player. Before the injury, he started on offense and defense and is also the Wildcats long snapper.

He was also the first player in WNY to commit to a Division I scholarship program when he accepted UB's scholarship offer in June.

"I really wanted to be at UB," Kling said. "Why hold out for anything else? That's where I wanted to go."

A day later, UB got a verbal commitment from Williamsville South quarterback Joe Licata.


"I talked to Joe Licata," Kling said. "He's really excited like I am. We both like the coaches and we're both looking forward to playing for them next year."

Kling says that he is confidant that the Wildcats will be able to play deep into November this season.

"We have some really big guys on the line," Kling said. "We have three guys that are over 6-4. We take a lot of pride in our line. I know the kids in there will play well."

Despite being the newest linemen at Depew, he has played in Ralph Wilson Stadium more than any other player on the roster. Kling played at 'The Ralph' three times for St. Mary's in the Msgr. Martin Association championship.

"I'm looking for big things this year," Kling said. "I'm looking to go to the Ralph again. I think we can do it."

# **Red Devils turn Yellow**



Clarence beat Orchard Park 37-28 in a thrilling game last weekend. It was the first time that Clarence has beaten Orchard Park since 2000.

Since that last victory over the Quakers, Clarence has suffered a string of futility at the hands of Orchard Park. "They beat us in the playoffs in 2002," Goddard said, "and

they beat us in 2006 at The Ralph. They've had our number for a decade."

Included in this string was the 2008 game in which both teams entered the game undefeated... and OP came away with a 48-0 win.

"That was humbling," Goddard said.

But, last weekend's win over Orchard Park will be one of the most memorable wins in Clarence football history.

Bruising tailback Mike Gelz ran for 177 yards and 3 TDs to lead the Red Devils.

"Mike is a workout fanatic," Goddard said. "He put on 20 pounds of muscle over the offseason."

Clarence led 22-21 at the half.

"When we got into the locker room I told the kids that I had just one question," Goddard said. "Can we play with these guys?' And the kids just exploded."

What followed was a hard-nosed, 8-minute drive for a TD that gave Clarence a 9-point lead. When the game ended, the student section swarmed the field in celebration.

But while all of this made for an exciting Friday night, none of of it made the game memorable.

What made the game an 'Instant Classic' was the fact that Clarence wore yellow jerseys... with no numbers or names on them.

Fans walking into the game, knowing that Clarence usually wore Red and Black, were immediately confused.

"We were on the field warming up with our regular black jerseys," Goddard said. "Orchard Park got off the bus with dark maroon jerseys. I didn't think anything of it. Some teams change into game jerseys right before the kickoff. But then they took the field in maroon jerseys. I knew there was a problem."

The problems started because Orchard Park has a huge JV program. The Baby Quakers have so many players that

the school does not have enough jerseys.

"I'm not going to tell a kid he can't play because we don't have enough jerseys," Athletic Director Jim Higgins said. "I ordered more jerseys but they aren't in yet. So until they come in, we have to share the jerseys between the varsity and the JV."

Higgins called Clarence Athletic Director Greg Kaszubski to ask if the teams could switch jerseys. Orchard Park would wear white for the JV game... but that meant that the white jerseys wouldn't be ready in time for the varsity game.

On the sidelines of the varsity game, Kaszubski confirmed the conversation.

"I thought they just wanted to switch for the JV game," Kaszubski said. "I didn't know they wanted to switch for the varsity game, too."

So... before the varsity game kicked off, both teams stood

there in almost identical jerseys wondering what to do.

Officials then informed Goddard that the rules state

that if the visitors show up in the wrong jersey, it is the responsibility of the home team to change.

Wow... who knew? "I didn't even know the rule existed," Goddard said. "Ignorance of the law is no defense but I've never even heard the rule mentioned in almost 30 years of coaching football."

The problem was that the Clarence players, certain that they would be wearing black that night, had all taken their white jerseys home. The only ractice jerseys

jerseys available were yellow practice jerseys. No numbers... no names. Just bright yellow mesh.

"We bought those jerseys because we needed something to practice in," Goddard said. "Fortunately we had them. They weren't clean but we took our jerseys off and put those on. The kids were ticked. But then, someone said we looked like Killer Bees. All of a sudden, it clicked and just tore through the locker room. Everyone was fired up and wanted to wear the yellow jerseys. We were all on the same page. We were together."

The offensive linemen had tape pasted to the front of their helmets so that referees could tell if there was an illegal man downfield. Stat keepers faced a nightmare prospect of trying to keep accurate stats with no numbers to identify players.

And the PA Announcer would occasionally inform the crowd that the pass was complete to, "A yellow jersey!"

And... maybe... a new tradition has been started? "I wouldn't mind that," Goddard said. "When Orchard Park comes to our place, we could wear yellow. Notre Dame wears green for USC. Maybe the boosters could buy us some regular yellow football jerseys. And when we play Orchard Park at home, we'll call it Yellow Jersey Night."
