


9 Vikings Stay Unbeaten

Currin Honored for Alden Win

Alden head coach Rob Currin has been named the Buffalo Bills / NY National Guard Coach of the Week after his Bulldogs beat Depew 28-7 last week.

"It was a classic Alden-Depew game," Currin said. "It was a big win. This is a win we had to have."

Alden opened the scoring and took a 6-0 lead when Brian Stoldt hit Dylan Dussault with a 5-yard TD pass in the first quarter.

After receiving the ensuing kickoff, Depew struck back in a hurry. The Wildcats took just 2 plays and scored on a 44-yard TD pass to take a 7-6 lead.

"The last two weeks, we've had a lot of back-andforth," Currin said. "So when Depew scored that quickly, nobody panicked."

Ryan Richards gave Alden its' lead back when he ran 21 yards for a TD. Lyle Grant ran in 2-point PAT and Alden led 14-7.

Late in the 2nd quarter, Alden scored again when they drove 85 yards for a TD. Grant rushed in from 5 yards out and Alden led 21-7 at the half.

is that we had to make last-minutes drives to get the win. It really gave us some work and experience under the gun and it showed against Depew."

Richards finished 68 yards on 17 carries and a TD while Grant ran 21 times for 130 yards and 2 TDs. Currin is pleased with his TB tandem.

"That's a nice 1-2 punch we have in the backfield," he said. "Thirty-eight carries for one back would have been a heck of a workload. It's nice to get fresh legs in there."

Alden used long, ball-control drives throughout the second half. Grant scored his second TD on a 2-yard run with 1:51 remaining in the 3rd guarter.

"We had the ball for 34 minutes in the game," Currin said. "We held it for 11 minutes in the 4th guarter. We were able to play keep away and we have to credit the offensive line for keeping the drives going."

Currin also said that his defense was ferocious.

"Our defensive coordinator, Tom Zaccardo, had an outstanding game plan," Currin said, "and our kids executed it perfectly."

Zaccardo served as the defensive coordinator under Dick Diminuco and Currin kept him on staff after Diminuco left for the college ranks after the 2012 season.

"My goal was to keep our staff as intact as possible," Currin said. "That was a major goal in the off-season. I wanted to keep everyone here."

Currin made just one minor change throughout the

program.

"Ken Partell has been our JV coach for 10 years." Currin said, "and we brought him up to coach the offensive line and the linebackers. We hired Sean Bruso to coach the JV team. Other than that, everybody came back."

Currin said he was adamant about keeping all of the coaches who worked under Diminuco.

"Cohesion only comes with time," he said. "We had a great staff with Coach Diminuco and we wanted to keep it going." Currin played

high school football under Jerry Smith at St. Francis.

"I was a senior when we just started to come onto the national scene," he said. "We finished 7-3 and lost close games to St. Ignatius and Erie Cathedral Prep. It was exciting to be a part of that football program and I still talk to Coach Smith on a bi-weekly basis."

After graduating, Currin played four seasons at Buffalo State. He served team captain during his senior year.

He was hired as an English teacher in Alden in 2006 and hired onto the football staff in 2007.

He says that learning under Smith, Jerry Boyes and Diminuco has been an invaluable education.

I could never repay any of those guys for what they gave me in terms of confidence, knowledge and experience," Currin said. "I could never repay them for that. Hopefully, some day, I can do it for someone else."

A Longtime Southern Tier Rivalry

Two of the more successful Class C programs in Section VI are Southwestern and Salamanca. Since NYS went to its current 5 classification system in 1996, Southwestern has won 3 VI titles, while Salamanca has the most of any of the C schools with 4. Southwestern has gone on to win two state titles while the Warriors lost at the Dome in 1999.

The programs are longtime rivals in the Southern Tier. In 1990, Salamanca had one of the best teams in WNY history and only gave up 2 TDs all season.

In the 7th week of the season, Southwestern upset the Warriors 7-6 to all but wrap up the Division title. However, the Trojans lost their final game of the season, giving the

Division title and a trip to the playoffs right back to the Warriors.

Salamanca beat Wilson 23-0 in Rich Stadium that season, one of eight shutouts the Warriors defense posted.

Current Salamanca coach Jason Marsh was a 2-way starter on that 1990 team.

Last season, these programs squared off in one of the most epic games in WNY history.

The Final Score of 47-46 Salamanca coach Jason Marsh only tells half of the story. Led by QB Jake Pilling,



Southwestern stormed out to an early 39-7 lead in the first half. Salamanca then woke up and scored the next 32 points, including a TD in the last moments of regulation. SW lineman Pete Trathen blocked a PAT for the second time in the game to send the contest into overtime.

Salamanca scored on its first possession to take a 46-39 lead. The Trojans answered when Andy Greenlee caught a TD pass on 3rd and 11 from the 21-yard line.

Southwestern coach Jay Sirianni opted to go for a 2point PAT and the win. The gamble paid off as Pilling found Hunter Peterson in the end zone.

The game was an epic battle between two QBs.

Salamanca's Tanner John ran for 126 yds and 5 TDs and also passed for another TD. Southwestern's Pilling ran for 137 yards and 4 TDs, while passing for 100 yards and 3 TDS.

This season, both schools are in the thick of the battle in Class C South. The winner likely will get to host a playoff game. Two proud programs fighting for playoff position with memories of last year's game fresh in their minds should make for an exciting game to watch in Week 5.

Smallest Tiger Playing Big

Akron rebounded from two straight losses to beat Tonawanda 33-22 last weekend to improve to 2-2 on the season, 2-1 in Class C North games.

After opening the season with a win, Akron had lost to Cleve Hill and Medina.

"This is huge," Akron coach Mike Dean said.
"Last year we had one of the best teams I have ever coached. We lost to Cleve Hill early in the year and that turned into a threegame losing streak."

Akron finished 6-3 but the 3-game losing streak kept them from qualifying for the playoffs.

"All three of our losses were league losses," Dean said. "We beat Fredonia and they ended up playing at the Ralph. Other coaches just could not believe we were not in the playoffs because we were a very good team."

Dean said that he was determined not to let losing streak happen where the season would slip away.

"I just told the kids that we can't go into this downward spiral again," he said. "We can't let losses control how we play next week."

Dean talked with his players about coming out fast after the loss to Medina.

"We talked about it last year," he said. "We didn't compete in the middle of the

season. The high school football season in Western New York is so short that you have to bring it every week. If you lose 3 in a row, your season is just about over. I'm convinced that our season was down to last Friday night with Tonawanda and the kids responded."

Akron has three games left to prove they belong in the playoffs. They will play JFK, Lackawanna and then Newfane to finish the regular-season schedule.

"We have a tough league again this year," Dean said. "Every week, we need to play against ourselves. If we do our best, we can win."

If Akron is going to run the table and make the playoffs, they will need big performances from one of the smallest players in Western New York.

Austen Lauricella, who is just 5-foot-6 and 170 pounds, has

been a huge asset for the Tigers this season.

After Tonawanda took a 22-19 in the third quarter, Lauricella returned the ensuing kickoff 76 yards for a TD.

"That completely turned the game around," Dean said. "It was such a crucial moment in the game. It was late in the third quarter and we needed to respond. Austen did."

Lauricella also rushed nine times for a team-high 76 yards in the win... and also caught 7 passes for another 83 yards.

"Austen has been on the varsity for three years,"
Dean said. "He is an incredibly smart player. He has been around the game for a long time. He knows the game."

Lauricella, a team captain, starts at WR for the Tigers. He also sees a lot of time at RB and occasionally steps in at QB.

"We want to get him the ball in a lot of different situations," Dean said. "He has a lot of skills so we want to use as much of his skill as possible."

Lauricella also starts at safety on defense, returns punts, returns kicks and serves as the Tigers kicker on PATs and field goals.

"Whatever he does, he does it well," Dean said. "He's an amazing kid and an amazing player."

Part of the reason that Lauricella is posting such large stats, is Akron is running the no-huddle offense.

"We have been averaging about 70 plays a game," Dean said. "That's helping us in the statistics, too. We ran 77 offensive plays against Cleve Hill and still lost."


Dean says he wants the Tigers to run their offense as fast as possible... and then, even faster then that.

"If we can get a play off before the defense gets lined up, we are going to run it," he said. "We have been building the no-huddle system since I got hired. Last season it became our primary offense. But now we are picking up the pace even more."

Dean says that the make-up of his team dictates a different offensive approach.

"We are not as big as most other teams," he said. "We can't always match up with other teams physically. But we have a lot of quick, little kids and good receivers. We want to get the kids out in space and let them go with it."

Cook is a solid student with an academic average in the 90s.


"He's a smart kid," Bass said. "and he's football savvy, too. He's Photo by Mark Adair studies a lot of film and he's a gym rat for football."




Huskies Have a Chance



Newfane Will Try to Rebound



WNY Rushing Leader is leading a Resurgence at Falconer

Falconer earned a second straight victory when the Falcons beat Silver Creek 28-14 last weekend.

The falcons are now 2-2 after opening the season with a pair of losses. Ordinarily, this would not be huge news but... in Falconer a second straight win is big.

"The last time we won two games in a row was six years ago," Falconer coach Dan Krenzer said. "The last time we were in a playoff contention was six years ago. Two wins in a row does not seem like much, but it's a big deal for us."

At one time, Falconer was one of the toughest programs in WNY.

In 2006. Falconer lost the NYS championship game in the Carrier Dome. The following season, the Falcons lost to Cleve Hill at Ralph Wilson Stadium in the Class C title game.

Falconer's program slipped the next few years and, recently, the

Falcons have been overlooked and dismissed by just about everybody.

"To some extent, we still are dismissed," Krenzer said. "And with good reason. We are getting better but we haven't been very good for a while. We couldn't get anything going. This is a good streak to have over."

The Falcons are also 2-2 in C South games and are squarely in the middle of the playoff race.

This week the Falcons, who are currently in 4th place, will play at Gowanda. Falconer will finish the season with games against Portville and arch-rival Southwestern. Wins in two of those games should be enough to qualify for the post-season tournament.

"The community is getting excited," Krenzer said. "We

are real happy. We have a ton of great parents in the program and we are getting a lot of people to come out to the games now. It's real reminiscent of the good times."

Krenzer says he is impressed with the way his players kept working when it may have been easier to give up.

"I'm real proud of them," he said. "I'm just glad to be around for this and I thankful to the kids thanks for taking me along for the ride."

In the win over Silver Creek, Cody Dustin exploded for 379 rushing yards... just one week after he exploded for 371 in a 45-28 win over Allegany-Limestone.

"Cody is doing a great job in the open field," Krenzer said. "He is very hard to tackle once he gets out into space."

Dustin is also benefitting from improved play along the offensive line.

"We are getting him some holes." Krenzer said. "The line, the full-

back are all doing great work. Even our quarterback is blocking. This has been a group effort."

To emphasize his point, Krenzer pointed out that RB DaShawn Jackson rushed for 50 yards on just 4 carries.

"That's more than 10 yards a carry," Krenzer said, "and that's over 400 yards rushing for the team. That's a lot of openings that the line is creating."

Incredibly, neither of Dustin's figures from the last two games, are even a school record. In 2004, Falconer's Curt Jones rushed for 391 yards in a game at Portville.

Krenzer says that he didn't know how many yards Dustin had piled up until he was told after the game. "We don't add up the stats as we go," he said. "The

only record I coach for is won-lost record. I knew his yardage was up there but I had no idea he had that many yards. The plays that he runs the ball, are plays that are working. If they stack 10 guys in a hole, we don't run him in that hole. We give the ball to someone else."

Krenzer does admit that the numbers that Dustin is posting are eye-popping.

"The stuff he is doing right now is headline stuff," Krenzer said. "I understand that almost 400 rushing yards two weeks in a row is going to get some attention."

Krenzer says that he feels his team is actually better than a 2-2 record would imply.

"When we lost to Salamanca and Fredonia, we made a ton of mistakes that translated into points," Krenzer said. "When you play a team like Fredonia you have to play perfect because they score quick. But for the last two games our kids have played well. All of a sudden they are just lighting it up. Now we have to keep improving."

Also, with three games left, there is still time to prove or disprove - just how good Falconer is - or isn't.

"We have Homecoming this week," Krenzer said. "More importantly, it's Gowanda which is another league game. If we win this one, we can almost say we are in the playoffs."

After a non-league game with Portville, the season ends with a traditional game against arch-rival Southwestern.

"Southwestern means an awful lot," Krenzer said. "It always means a lot. We haven't beaten them since 2007 and, for these kids, that would be huge."

Speaking of huge, Cody Dustin isn't.

The senior running back is just 5-foot-7 and 160 pounds... but the stats that he is posting are incredibly big.

"He's not very big," Krenzer said, "but he has a thick lower body and runs low. He's hard to bring down because of his strength."

Dustin is also fast.

"When he accelerates and gets into the open field, he just doesn't slow down," Krenzer said. "I don't think a lot of kids could catch him."

Thanks to the past two weeks, Dustin has now rushed for 850 yards, more than any other player in WNY.

"He's gaining confidence," Krenzer said. "The rest of the guys are gaining confidence, too. You can see it in how they make the play calls and line calls. They are all gaining confidence and that's what we need."

Dustin, who is also on the Falconer wrestling and track teams, says that he is just trying to help the Falcons get back to the playoffs.

"We're just trying to put in a full team-effort," the senior said. "We are pushing hard in practice. We need to win and bring pride back to Falconer football. We want people to know that we are not a bad team any more."

Duston qualified for the Sectional tournament in wrestling and maintains an academic average of 91. His brother. Rvan. is currently the Falcons starting QB.

"We're close, especially on the football field," Duston said. "It's fun playing with him, especially with him being the quarterback and me being in the backfield with him."

Are You Game?

Why did Damon Die?



It's been three weeks since Westfield running back Damon Janes died.

When word of Janes death first spread, it was blamed on a helmet-to-helmet collision. The Buffalo News ran a headline that stated that Janes died after a helmet-to-helmet collision. Reporters for the News have said that the statement released by the Hospital and the Janes family confirmed that Damon had died after a helmet-to-helmet collision.

Portville coach Gary Swetland disputed that. He said a violent hit never happened that night.

I can now tell our readers that I have watched the game film of the fateful night and... Swetland is 100 percent correct.

There was NO violent helmet-to-helmet collision in Westfield's game at Portville.

I watched the game film earlier this week and I saw absolutely nothing that would cause anyone to think that a player would die from playing football. Janes really wasn't even hit particularly hard that night.

I watched the game twice, in fact, and it's just not there... at all.

However, I was also able to view Westfield's game at Randolph, which was played the week before.

Janes DID have a violent helmet-to-helmet collision in that game. It's on Play #28... a kickoff right after Randolph had scored in the second quarter.

Janes, blocking on the play, launches himself into a Randolph player who is running down the field to cover the kick. The players collide and their helmets slam together... forehead-to-forehead. Both players fall heavily to the ground. Both players get up and head to their sidelines.

Did Damon Janes suffer a concussion on that play? Or in that game? Right now, no one knows.

But, if he did, then a week later in Portville, Janes may have suffered an injury called Second Impact Syndrome... an injury that is so deadly that death can result in just two to five minutes of the second injury.

Second Imact Syndrome is a condition in which the brain swells rapidly and catastrophically after a person suffers a second concussion before symptoms from an earlier concussion have subsided. This deadly second blow may occur minutes, days or even weeks after the initial concussion and even the mildest grade of concussion can lead to Second Impact Syndrome.

The condition is often fatal, and almost everyone who is not killed is severely disabled.

When we interviewed him two weeks ago, Swetland said that his school's trainer had mentioned Second Impact Syndrome the night of the game.

We called Swetland on Wednesday evening to confirm that statement.

"It was after the game and I still didn't know what had happened." Swetland said. "A game had just been canceled and I still didn't know why. I asked our trainer, 'What the hell happened to that kid?' He answered in an off-hand way, 'I don't know but it looked like Second Impact Syndrome.' At the time, I really didn't even understand what he said."

The Football Weekly contacted Portville trainer Matt Gnan and he declined to be interviewed about any specifics of the evening of the Westfield game at Portville. He agreed to answer only general questions about Second Impact Syndrome.

Gnan said there is no specific symptom that would lead anyone to say for certain whether Second Impact Syndrome occurs in anyone. When pressed for what he saw that night that with Damon Janes, Gnan declined to answer.

If Janes did suffer from Second Impact Syndrome, then, when he scored his final varsity TD that night, he was already dead... it just hadn't happened yet.

I can't say for certain that Janes did suffer a Second Impact Syndrome injury that caused his death. I also can not say that he sustained a concussion the week before against Randolph.

I know that looked like a hell of a shot he took in the game against Randolph... and I know there was no such shot in the game against Portville. To reiterate... I

have seen BOTH games.

But... did he mention anything to anyone? Did he complain to anyone about headaches? Did he miss school or practice because he felt nauses or dizzy? Did he vomit at all in the week leading up to the game at Portville

We don't know.

Unfortunately, that is also the answer to the question: Why did Damon Die?... We don't know.

One thing I do know... 16-year-old boys will lie and hide anything if they think they are going to be pulled out of a game and not allowed to play. They want to play. They will lie to any adult who questions their health and even hints that the kid should not be on the field.

If there can possibly be one good thing to come out of the tragedy of a high school player's death it is this:

Kids... you can not hide this stuff anymore. If you suffer headaches or feel dizzy... you need to tell someone.

We all love football, but no football game is worth your life... and, yes, it can happen to you.
